

Term Project – Presentation: Emerging Technologies

Project Description (Presentation): Choose a particular field and discuss an emerging technology that you think will have major impact in that field.

For the presentation (which will be presented), you will use software such as MS PowerPoint. You will also be required to choose another technology that you'd like to work with. You can choose to create a web page, create a YouTube video, and / or incorporate any other media you consider appropriate to create a dynamic project.

Groups: You will work in groups of 3-4. **Each person in the group will have to account for what they did in the project so keep track.**

Late assignments will not be accepted.

Part I Choose a topic:

Select a topic in consultation with instructor. Your instructor must approve your topic BEFORE you start working on it.

Please email me the following.

1. Emerging Technology Topic
2. A couple of paragraphs describing your topic.
3. A list of 3 – 4 individuals that will be working in your group.

NOTE: No two groups will be allowed to work on the same topic. It will be first come first serve. Submit your topic choice early.

Please email me with all the above. One person can do the emailing and CC: the rest of the group members.

Part II Project Description

Once your topic has been approved, post the title and a more thought out description of your topic to Desire2Learn (only one person has to post but it needs to have all your

names in it). Describe what you hope to get out of working on your group project. **Everyone** (all people individually) need to reply to at least one group's post (not your own) and offer a comment or advice.

Part III – Bibliography

Research the area. You will need at least 10 references and at least 2 of them need to be scholarly*. Be sure to indicate which of your sources are scholarly.

Submit a full annotated bibliography to your instructor through Desire2Learn. Use a standard format for your bibliography, like the MLA, APA or Chicago style (your choice). You will need to include the information specified in that style, such as the author(s), year published, conference or journal, etc. For each item in your bibliography, write a brief sentence (the annotation) explaining what it is and / or its place in your presentation.

*Examples of scholarly papers can be conference or journal articles. While news articles might be very interesting and can be included in your bibliography, it does not count as a scholarly article. Using Google Scholar can help you find scholarly articles (Google News can help you find news articles). Another site that can help explain how to identify scholarly articles is <http://www.library.cornell.edu/olinuris/ref/research/skill20.html> Look under the topic of "Scholarly".

Note: You may modify some of the references later.

Part IV – Outline

Prepare an outline of your presentation and submit it through Desire2Learn to your instructor. The outline should consist of bullets listing the different sections you plan to have in your presentation (with details describing each section). You must also **specify** the technologies that you will be using in your presentation.

Part V – Submit Presentation

1. Email me your presentation materials - e.g., PowerPoint file, class handouts (if any), any URL for a website, YouTube video, etc. that you created.
2. Prepare a 10 minute presentation. Each person in your group should present part of the presentation.
3. Each person will need to email me individually a document stating what their own contributions were to this project and the contributions of their teammates.
