

Summary of Lists and Tables

CSS for Lists:

In CSS modify **both** your **ul** and **ol** tags so that they are not the defaulted bullets/numbers. Example is below:

```
ul { list-style-type: square;}
```

Tables :

```

  <tr>
    <td> Row 1 Col 1</td>
    <td> Row 1 Col 2</td>
  </tr>
  <tr>
    <td> Row 2 Col 1</td>
    <td> Row 2 Col 2</td>
  </tr>
</table>
```

<td rowspan="#"> (where # is a number)
```

<td colspan="#"> (where # is a number)
```

<thead>

```

CSS Table Formatting without Classes, Examples:

```
thead{background-color:aqua} /*modifying the heading row*/
```

```
td:first-child {background-color:purple} /*modifies the first column*/
```

```
td:nth-child(2){background-color:green}/*modifies the second  
column*/  
tr:nth-child(even) {background-color:yellow} /*modifies all even rows  
*/
```
